Course Background

- Food Systems Education development student will learn the formal "farmer training" landscape and program delivery models, how courses like this are developed
- Teamwork, presentation skills and accountability student will work with the Teaching Team to help co-develop and steer their own piece of the larger project – revamping the Sustainable Agriculture Practicum Program at the UBC Farm, there will be research, tasks and deadlines
